

Medicaid transportation



How can I use Medicaid transportation?

By law, you may use Medicaid transportation to get:

- Health care treatment
- A health care evaluation
- To your home after being discharged from the hospital
- Prescription medicines
- Medical equipment

What information do I need when I call to set up transportation?

Have the information listed below ready to share with the customer service representative. This will help speed things up.

- Your child's full name, phone number, address, date of birth and county of residence (where he lives)
- Medicaid number as it appears on his Georgia Medicaid card or your child's social security number
- An emergency contact name and phone number
- The address and phone number of where you are going, as well as the doctor's name and health care facility name
- Your child's mobility status (whether he walks, uses a wheelchair or needs a stretcher)
- Any special needs (like needing oxygen or an escort)
- Your child's room number (only if he needs a stretcher)

What else do I need to know?

Keep in mind these helpful tips when setting up Medicaid transportation for your child:

- Set up Medicaid transportation 3 week days ahead of all outpatient visits.
- Call from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. to set up transportation.
- You can set up more than one ride at the time of your call.
- **Please note:** hospital discharges do not require a 3 day advance notice. The pick-up time for a hospital discharge can be from 30 minutes to 3 hours from the time of your call.
- Your child's escort must be 18 years or older. There is no fee for the escort.
- There is no co-pay required for non-emergency transport.
